

Bill Lesniak reports that we'll have a field trip associated with the show to Alasa Farm (Second Creek) in Alton, NY. This will be a fossil dig of Silurian-age rock in the Clinton Formation. Fossils found at this location include clusters of brachiopod "Pentamerus oblongus", pearly layers of "Coelospira hemispherica", Graptolites "Monograptus" in the Williamson Shale, Bryozoa "Fenestella", thousands of Crinoid pieces and some thin veins of hematite. If time allows we'll trip over to Chimney Bluffs State Park - a nationally known erosional feature, a truncated drumlin, along Lake Ontario. Sign up with Bill or sign up at the meeting or show. This trip will be on Sunday the third of June beginning around noon at the show.

Posters, fliers & lawn signs need to be put up in our communities. These will be available at the 5/11 meeting. This is a working meeting. 20% Inspiration 80% Perspiration. Let's have some fun getting the finishing touches on this thing. See you soon!

The History of Goldstone

Goldstone is a type of glass made with copper or copper salts in the presence of a reducing flame. Under normal oxidative conditions, copper ions meld into the silica to produce transparent bluish-green glass; when the reduced goldstone melt cools, the copper remains in atomic isolation and precipitates into small crystalline clusters. The finished product can take a smooth polish and be carved into beads, figurines, or other artifacts suitable for semiprecious stone, and in fact goldstone is often mistaken or misrepresented as a natural material.

The most common form of goldstone gives the illusion of being reddishbrown, although in fact that color comes from the copper crystals and the glass itself is colorless. Some goldstone variants have an intensely-colored glass matrix--

usually blue or violet, more rarely green-- and a more silvery appearance to the suspended crystals, whose color may be partially masked by the glass or which may be based on different metals than copper (perhaps cobalt, manganese, or chromium).

The manufacturing process for goldstone was discovered in seventeenth-century Venice by the Miotti family, which was granted an exclusive license by the "Doge" (The chief magistrate and leader of the Most Serene Republic of Venice). Persistent folklore attributes the discovery and secret of goldstone to an unnamed Italian monastic order, giving rise to the alternate name "monk's gold" or "monkstone". Another name, "stellaria", is based on the starry internal reflections.







The Pear also goes by "the Drop".
