The investigation continues & I'll keep you posted on that progress. A Power-Point presentation of Glacier National Park was an enjoyable perk during our visit. I didn't know the park was only open 3 or 4 months a year. When t was time to leave, we expressed our thanks in the form of Girl Scout cookies [which our guide Ursula really enjoyed] and we left there having forged yet another bond with other rockhounds and renewed our mission to continue exploring where the professionals have little time to go. The meeting on Nov. 13, 2009 was called to order at 8:30PM. The Secretary's report from our Oct. meeting was read and accepted. The motion to accept the minutes as read made by Bill Lesniak. Seconded by Rocky Rowe.

He reminded everyone of the next day's field trip to the Museum of the Earth in Ithaca. We are to meet at 10 AM there on Saturday morning. He also said to bring any fossil we wanted identified as experts from PRI [Paleontology Research Institute] would be there.
