President's Message

Hello Folks,

The Board of Directors and the Field Trip Committee have been working on programs, places to visit and places to explore & dig. In line with this train of thought, consider where you want to travel this season. If a NYS citizen crosses the border into Canada, Mexico and certain countries or territories in the Caribbean, you might need either a passport or an EDL [Enhanced Driver License] or an ENDID [a Non-Driver Photo ID]. Extensive information is available through the NYS DMV website at www.nysdmv.com/edl-main.htm or call 518-474-9981 M-F 8 AM to 4 PM. High points are this program are that an enhanced license will help expedite travel at the border, costs less than a passport and fits in your wallet. Things to consider are whether you expect to travel abroad in the next few years where you'll need a passport. Are you going by plane? How often will you cross these borders? When you get an EDL, it's valid until your license is due for renewal and then it expires. If you renew your license early [when you apply for the EDL], the EDL will then expire when your next renewal date is. The EDL cost is \$30 above & beyond your normal license renewal costs. Passports cost more than \$100 at this time. Which is right for you? Only you know but consider your options now and have your documents in order before you hit the road this coming season. Amazing striped icebergs

(Contributed by Pat Chapman)Icebergs in Lake Michigan sometimes have stripes, formed by layers of snow that react to different conditions. Blue stripes are often created when a crevice in the ice sheet fills up with melt water and freezes so quickly that no bubbles form. When an iceberg falls into the lake, a layer of water can freeze to the underside. If this is rich in algae, it can form a green stripe. Brown, black and yellow lines are caused by sediment, picked up when the ice sheet grinds downhill towards the lake.

Dinosaur gets lift at Rochester Museum & Science Center

It's impossible to use the front door when you're delivering a robotic dinosaur that's 26 feet long and 7 feet tall. Instead, workers used a crane to lift the apatosaurus model to exhibit space on Rochester Museum & Science Center's third floor. Dimetrodon and stegosaurus models from the Catawba Science Center in Hickory, N.C., will be part of RMSC's enhancements to the "Be the Dinosaur: Life in the Cretaceous" exhibit that opens on Feb. 5. Even at 26 feet long, the apatosaurus is only one-third the size it would have been in prehistoric times. RMSC is also adding children's activities fossils from its own collections to the main exhibit, which has visitors learning about dinosaurs' environments. The highlight is the Be the Dinosaur Simulator Pod that simulates sights, smells, sounds and action of a tyrannosaurus rex, triceratops and other creatures one might encounter. The exhibit is on display until May 4. Admission is \$12 (\$10 for seniors, students and youth). Call (585) 271-4320 or go to www.rmsc.org.
